As we approach the end of another term, I want to take this opportunity to reflect on the incredible journey of growth and learning that our students have embarked upon. It has been a privilege to witness their bravery, creativity, and resilience in the face of various challenges. Your continued support and involvement in your child's education have been instrumental in fostering a positive and nurturing environment within our school community.

This term has been particularly enriching with events such as the Careers Fayre, where over 50 representatives of local businesses and educational institutions participated, including our highest number of post-16 representatives ever. It was a fantastic opportunity for our students to explore potential career paths and gather valuable insights into various industries. Additionally, I am delighted to share that All Saints Academy has been recognized as one of only 25 schools internationally to receive the Sparx Reader Award for Progress, a testament to our commitment to building a true legacy of reading throughout he school.

Furthermore, our Year 11 students have been working harder than ever to prepare for their GCSEs. With dedicated staff providing additional intervention, All Saints' pupils are receiving an additional day's worth of time each week to support their studies and ensure they are well-prepared for their examinations. Alongside their academic endeavours, our students have also had the opportunity to engage in enriching experiences such as visits to Bletchley Park, training with the Royal Engineers, and many more, broadening their horizons and inspiring their love for learning.

As we approach the upcoming half-term, I encourage you to take this time to celebrate your child's accomplishments and spend quality time together as a family. Your ongoing support and encouragement play a vital role in nurturing their continued growth and success. This is never more important than making sure our young people attend school every day. We recognise that there is a national trend of decreasing attendance, but even occasional days off can have a significant impact on a child's future successes. I encourage you to make a commitment with your child to achieve over 95% for the following half-term so that we can approach the next academic year with the confidence that we have secured this year's learning.










Maths
