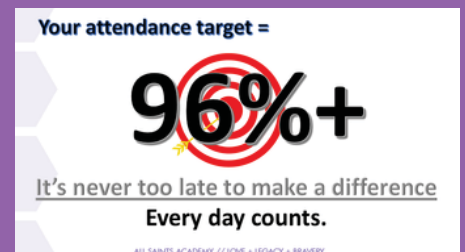

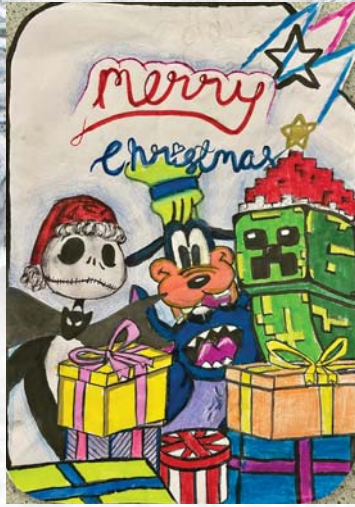

**On 14th November the Year 11 Geographers braved storm Claudia and the wind and rain to complete their physical Geography fieldwork at Dawlish Warren. The students measured the height of the sand either side of the groynes to assess the successfulness of the sea defences at Dawlish Warren. Students also attended a talk by a Dawlish Warren Ranger who discussed the history of the spit and the different processes that occur on the sand dunes, as well as providing the students with information about his role and the challenges of managing a range of different stakeholders perspectives in the local area.**





This November a group of students from Year 10 took part in the RIBA CityScope Competition which is an inspiring architectural design challenge for students aged 15-18. The twelve students were set a design brief that would usually be tackled by university aged students. The task was to design a community hub for homeless people in Exeter's city centre.

Students had to research and analyse the wide range of challenges faced by the homeless and consider their needs and wants while designing a public building that would bring a diverse range of the community together. At the event

which was hosted in the Exeter Corn Exchange, the students were split into two groups and were in competition with around 15 other teams from across the region. Each team worked with an experienced architect, a site visit was conducted and then analysis of the extensive elevation drawing resources and building requirements. The teams spent the day, working together, sketching, rendering, and model making with the aim to communicate their fantastic ideas to the judges. It was amazing to see how well the students rose to the challenge, showing fantastic team work, thoughtful consideration of the user needs and some really exciting model making skills. The final designs boasted a wide range of facilities from laundry services, private meeting rooms, cafes, shower facilities and mental health support.

What was exceptional though were the considerations of building aesthetics, ergonomics, functionality and inclusivity. The students presented their outstanding work to the judges really well and received great feedback on their ideas. Despite not bringing any prizes home on this occasion, the students were thrilled by the experience and had thoroughly enjoyed this insight to the work of an architect which was overall really inspiring.

# Seafood Soup Project



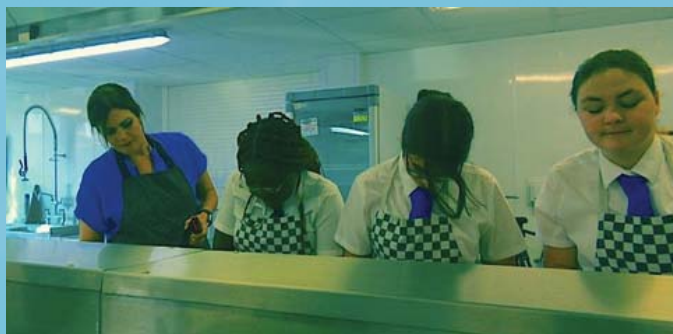
Some of our year 9 students have been involved in an exciting new project that is being run by the Plymouth Fishing and Seafood Association. They were able to join Edward Baker and chef Matt Corner in one of the technology kitchens at All Saints Academy. The project they took part in was to batch produce a fish soup that could potentially be sold to the public. This first session was a practice to see if the making of the soup would be successfully done within the school's facilities. Edward Baker has written a few paragraphs about what the project is and what it involves.

The Seafood Plymouth soup project is about creating sustainable food from products that may otherwise go to waste. We are using fish frames (head, bones and tail) from fish sold in Plymouth and we also intend to use gleaned vegetables. The soup is vegetable/tomato based, it tastes delicious and is not what you would normally expect from a fish soup, it has a richer almost spicy flavour and is designed to appeal to more people.

This is a community centric project; by making the soup with All Saints Academy we are providing young people with a practical application to their studies. We are exploring ways that we can use the soup to help relieve food poverty and simultaneously support the local fishing fleet.

The students really got stuck in to prepping the vegetables and fish. They showed their amazing skills learnt in food and nutrition lessons and worked well with Matt to produce the amazing soup. It tasted delicious! This was a great opportunity for our students as it gave them experience working with professionals.

The soup making was a great success and there will be more opportunities for our students to get involved with in the future. Very exciting!

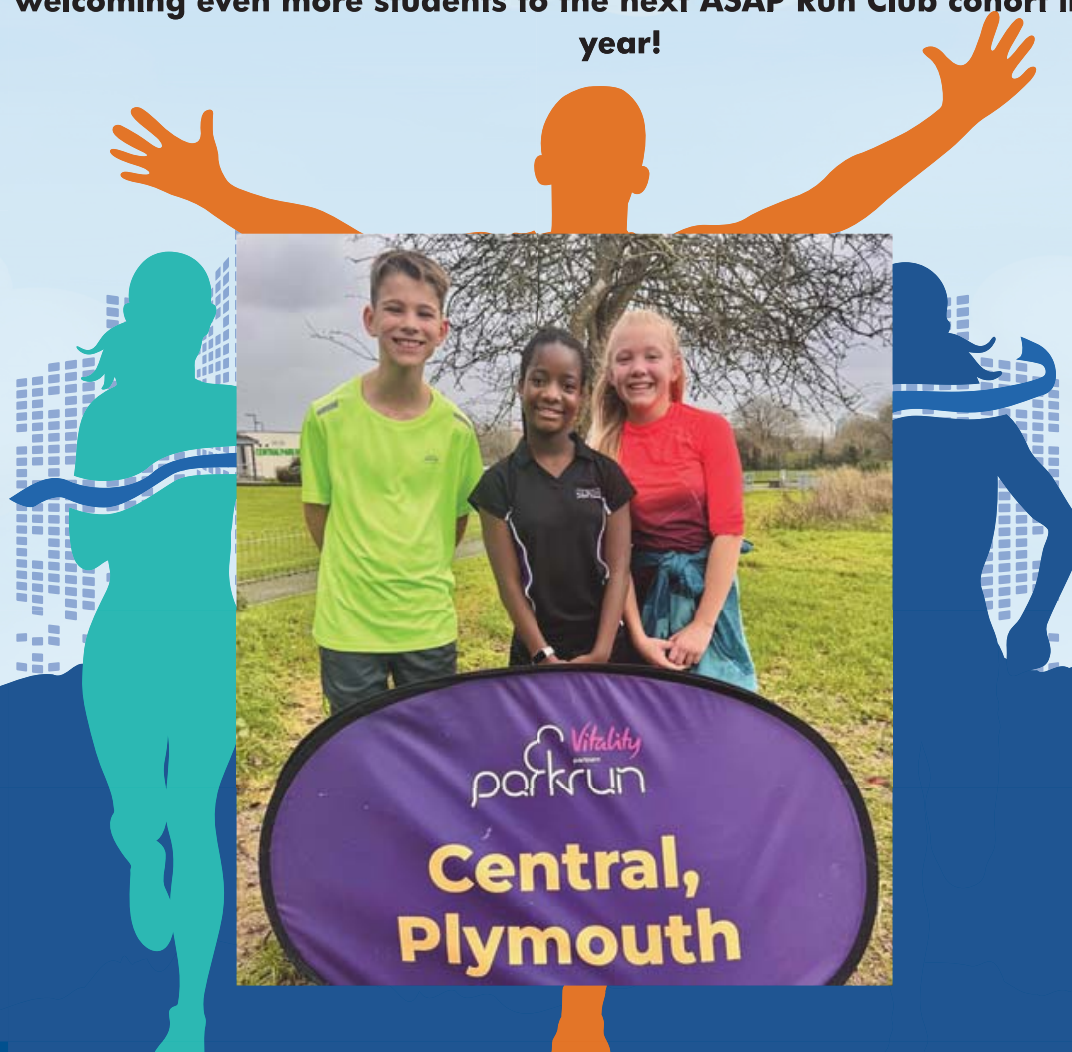
# Run Club
