Online Work

Year 11 Exams

Exams will now not be taking place this academic year for our current Year 11s. We have written to Year 11 parents/students to outline the process now for awarding grades. Please rest assured that the process is fair and robust to submit judgment grades. This will then be looked at by Ofqual and they will award grades in the summer term, in the normal results window (August). Schools are not allowed to release grades earlier so we ask that you do not contact teachers to ask for these, as we will be unable to provide this information.

Free School Meals

As you may be aware, the Department of Education has agreed to send out a £10 voucher each week to parents/carers of children who are eligible for free school meals, to be spent on food at the supermarket. All Saints submitted details to the DfE on Monday last week for this. However, there has been a national hold up which the DfE apologises for. They are working as quickly as possible to get this sent out. Thank you for your patience with this.
